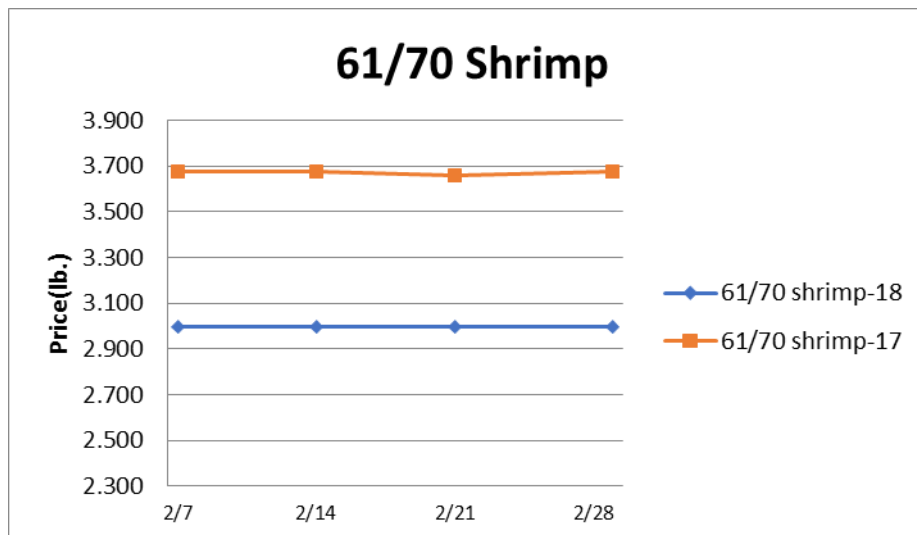


Seafood

The shrimp markets continue to track close to 2017 levels due in part to solid imports. During December, the U.S. imported 13.4% more shrimp than the previous year despite trade with Thailand remaining a disappointment. Various countries have made up for the downfall in Thai production which should keep U.S. shrimp imports strong into the spring.
